The University Extension Project "Raise your hand. The right to experience the intersubjective space" calls to participate at the 14^o United Nations Model of the National University of Quilmes (known in Spanish as MONUUNQ) addressed to students, teachers and authorities of elementary schools, middle schools, high schools and universities. The role play will be held on **Thursday 29th and Friday 30th, August 2019**, in Bernal (Saénz Peña St. 352). Registration is free of charge. The activity is supported by the UNQ's Bachelor degree in Social Sciences and International Trade Administration//by the Administration of both careers Social Sciences and International Trade.

The United Nations Model is a staging of the international relationship system inside United Nations sphere of action, with its structure, protocol and real performance. Each participant will play the role of an international diplomatist, from a specific country, considering its foreign policy. Throughout the meetings, students will address global issues adopting a critical and holistic point of view during the debates, enabling them to strengthen their position without forfeiting the collective belonging. We believe that the coexistence of plurality and diversity favors negotiation skills development and consensus, creating opportunities for the development of several skills such as oratory, leadership, and conflict resolution by peaceful means, among others.

Next year's issue will be **"Crime prevention and Penal Justice"**. The four commissions will address this theme, pursuing a real transference of knowledge and values in human rights education, at the different levels of participation of the educative community.

❖ Registration

Applicants send an email to: monuunq@unq.edu.ar with an obligatory copy to monuunq@gmail.com. Registration forms and Training Guides can be downloaded from the web page: https://ddhh.unq.edu.ar/?page_id=119.

These are the official communication channels between the project coordination, the educative institutions and the educative agents. In order to guarantee a plural and diverse participation, each school will be able to sign up for a maximum of 4 (four) delegations, with the possibility to add one more after the 1st stage of country allocation.

❖ Registration process

- ✓ 1st stage of Country allocation: **Thursday 2 of May, 2019**. The applications sent before that date will have priority. After this stage is done, the remaining countries could be chosen.
- ✓ 2nd stage of Country allocation (only if there are delegations available): **Tuesday, August 13, 2019**.

❖ Academic Activities in 2019

- ✓ Training course on "Human Rights and Diversity in the International Community", free and open to the community. It will be held on 8 Saturdays from April 6 to June 1, 2019 at the National University of Quilmes, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. Participants write to: monuunq@unq.edu.ar
- ✓ Workshops of the training course will be coordinated with educational establishments (public and private).
- ✓ Work Sessions in the educational communities based on the central subject of the role playing.
- ✓ Virtual exchanges with students, teachers and authorities. Circulation of Training Guides and Regulations, prepared by the scholar team of the activity.
- ✓ **Workshop (Thursday 2 May)** from 8:30 to 13:00 hs., at the National University of Quilmes Auditorium. This is the deadline to submit the documentation to participate in the role playing. If mandatory documentation is not presented, the Organizing Committee may reassign delegations.
- ✓ General Training Sessions: Tuesday, August 13 from 8:30 to 13:00 hs., in the National University Auditorium.
- ✓ **Art Exhibition** inspired around the central subject of the United Nations Model. Productions elaborated in the framework of the different workshops will be displayed. Several recognized plastic artists will take part presenting their art works. The central conference, Tuesday October 8, 2019, will be the last academic activity aimed at creating an atmosphere of reflection and exchange with the all the participants.

TOPICS PER COMMISSION

❖ **Secondary Commissions**

Students may form delegations of four (4) members. Two (2) members will participate in the Congress of Crime Prevention and Penal Justice, and one (1) in the Commission of Crime Prevention and Penal Justice. The remaining (1) student will participate as Ambassador, being able to rotate their participation between both commissions, articulating the work of the entire delegation. In addition, the Ambassador will take part in a special commission, called the "Summit of Ambassadors", which will deal with an emergency situation related to the central subject of the United Nations Model.

1) Congress of Crime Prevention and Penal Justice [C1]

➤ **A Topic. Organized transnational crime: human trafficking.**

- ∴ Policies to combat human trafficking for the purpose of sexual exploitation at the national and transnational levels.
- ∴ Protection and assistance for victims of human trafficking.

2) Commission of Crime Prevention and Criminal Justice [C2]

➤ **B Topic. Penitentiary System and Human Rights.**

- ∴ Alternative measures to imprisonment.
- ∴ Measures to guarantee the social reintegration of former convicts.

❖ **Primary Commission and University Commission**

The commissions of primary and university level will be held independently, in parallel, to the secondary commissions.

3) UNESCO—Two primary students per delegation.

➤ **C Topic. Gender violence prevention.**

- ∴ The sexual education of children and adolescents.
- ∴ Measures to guarantee the right to education of the girls and adolescents.
- ∴ Discrimination against girls in educational institutions.

4) Security Council [CS] – Two university students per delegation.

➤ **D Topic. (mandatory). Trafficking and Illicit Manufacturing of Small Arms and Light Weapons.**

➤ **E Topic. (mandatory). Measures to combat International Terrorism.**
